# 31st WOODTICK POETRY RETREAT

Let the woods and water of Northern Minnesota inspire you at the 31st annual Woodtick Poetry Writing Retreat on Horseshoe Lake, Merrifield, MN, held Thursday, July 18 through Sunday, July 21. Join fellow poets for writing, reading, presenting, swimming and swatting mosquitoes. Bring food, your poems, a swimsuit, and a long-sleeved shirt for evening wear. Towels and bed linens will be provided, but housekeeping is a shared responsibility.

Each poet should be prepared to lead a 30-minute (or longer) writing workshop or discussion on a topic of their choosing, and we will have several read-around sessions to share poetry.

#### **Directions**

The retreat location is 13362 SW Horseshoe Lake Road, Merrifield, MN.

From the mall in Brainerd, go north on 8th Ave NE (also known as Hwy 25 or County Rd 3) to Merrifield (about 8 miles). North of Merrifield, you'll need to turn right (east) at the Half Moon Saloon to stay on County Rd 3.

Continue 7 miles north, (past Ossipee Corners), where the speed limit reduces to 45. Turn right (east) on the first blacktop road after you see "Jim's Campers" on the right. Take Mission Park Dr to Oak Spur and turn left (north). At the first stop sign, make a sharp right onto Horseshoe Lake Dr, then take the first driveway on the left. Look for the Daughters of MURRY & BARBARA STEVENS sign in front of the cabin.

# THE MOCCASIN IS IN PROGRESS: SEND POEMS!

Each year the League of Minnesota Poets publishes *The Moccasin*, a chapbook of poems by LOMP members. Please submit your best work, especially poems that have won an NFSPS contest prize or have been published. Email your poems (in .doc format) or mail them to by Saturday, July 13. Follow these guidelines for your submission:

- You must be a current member of LOMP; if you didn't pay your dues in January, do it now.
- Keep it short—8 lines or shorter, and no more than 32 lines (unless your poem won an NFSPS contest).
- Title your poem (unless submitting haiku or senryu).
- If you mail your poems, use 8-1/2 inch x 11-inch paper, one poem per page. Use an easily read font and do not print on both sides of the paper. Include your name and phone number on each page.
- Proofread carefully. If you punctuate a poem unconventionally, please notify the editor so she does not make corrections.

- Category 1: \$2 per poem (limit 8 poems)
- All other categories: \$1 per poem (limit 1 poem per category)

Poems will not be returned. Poems submitted for Categories 1-18 will not be published.

Previously published—but not prizewinning—poems will be accepted for this category (and only this category). All submissions in this category will be considered for publication in *The Moccasin*.



## **QUALIFICATIONS**

- 1. Poems must be the original, unpublished\* work of the contestant.
- 2. Poems that have won **monetary** awards are not eligible.
- 3. A poem can be submitted for only one category.
- 4. Submit only one poem per category, except Category 1, where the limit is 8 poems.
- 5. Sponsors may enter a poem in the category they sponsor.
- 6. Print poems on plain  $81/2 \times 11$  white paper. Do not include artwork or copyright marks. Choose a legible font, use only one column, and do not duplex.
- 7. All poems—with the exception of haiku—must be titled.
- 8. If the poem exceeds one page, staple the pages together.
- 9. Submit 2 copies of each poem:
  - Include only the category number and category name in the upper left corner. This copy will be used for judging, and must not have any identifying marks.
  - On the second copy, add your name, address, email address and LOMP membership status to the upper right corner.
