You must be a current LOMP member to attend, so be sure your 2020 dues have been paid. The fee for the Retreat is \$80 for the full weekend. Information on the retreat is included in the newsletter, and although there will be a cost this year to rent a facility to house us, we are making efforts to keep it affordable.

From the Moccasin, to the Conferences, the chapters and all that they do, the hours of commitment fill me with a gratitude that is impossible to express. I look forward to making the new year even more inspiring and successful in this great state of Poetry.







Submit a manuscript of ten original, unpublished poems, and a \$10 fee by midnight PST January 31, 2020. You will be required to confirm that your poetry is original and unpublished. Contestants may not use any material copyrighted by another author as the basis for their poems.

Complete the application form and upload your manuscript file online at nfsps.submittable.com/submit. The manuscript must be a single document that contains only your title page followed by ten poems. Insert a page break after the text of each poem. Once you have uploaded the file, you cannot make edits. Acceptable file formats include .doc and .docx (MS Word) and pdf

To be eligible, you must be an undergraduate working toward a degree in an accredited US college or university during the submission period (December 1, 2019 through January 31, 2020).

Two winners will be chosen, one receiving the Edna Meudt Memorial Award; the other receiving the Florence Kahn Memorial Award. Winners and entrants will be notified by email on Monday, March 11. Winners will be announced in the April issue of *Strophes*, the NFSPS newsletter.
