NFSPS NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP POETRY SLAM

On October 20-23, 2022, the National Federation of State Poetry Societies (NFSPS) in cooperation with the Florida State Poets Association (FSPA) are sponsoring the first annual national championship slam poetry competition in Daytona Beach, Florida. Competitors are expected from across the country and will be limited to 48 of the top spoken word poets. Each of the 33 member states will be eligible to enter their best poets in the competition. States will be invited to choose representatives in competitions held in the spring of 2022, with the final national competition to be held in the fall. Detailed suggested guidelines are being developed for all states that opt to participate, but final decisions on how to choose state representatives will be by each state organization. A limited number of entries, (approx. 20) will be opened to independent competitors who have won non FSPA sponsored slams in 2022.

LAKE SUPERIOR WRITERS

Lake Superior Writers is accepting entries in multiple genres for its annual writing contest. Submissions should explore the theme "Full Circle," and are due April 11. Interpret the theme as broadly as you wish. For example, write about lives that follow a circle returning to the starting point but with new insights, or relationships that may follow this pattern, or the circle of nature. Winners will be notified by May 11.




